Last week the Preps had their very first PMP session in our newly designed Multi-Purpose Space. It has been an exciting and worthwhile wait as this space has been transformed into an amazing open, well-lit and appointed space suitable for the successful running of the PMP program and many other varied activities within the school.

Well, what is PMP?

PMP develops perceptions and language through experiences that are sequential in design and progressively become more difficult and complex as the year goes by.

Perceptual deals with obtaining information and motor refers to the outcome of the movement. Perceptual motor activities require students to use their brain and body together to accomplish tasks; for example; walking along the beam whilst counting backwards from 10.
