Dear Community,

Happy Feast Day!

Today is great day... a day to celebrate the gift of St. Mary MacKillop to our world.

Mary MacKillop was born on 15 January 1842 in Fitzroy. She died on 8 August 1909 in Nth Sydney and is buried in Nth Sydney in St. Joseph's Chapel in Mount Street.

Mary was an ordinary woman living an extraordinary life. She was born into poverty and as a child lived from house to house with her family and then with relatives.

Mary was sent to work as a governess to some children in Penola, South Australia. She was only 18 years of age. There she met a local priest, Fr. Julian Tenison-Woods, who encouraged and supported Mary in starting a school for children in the district who did not have the opportunity to receive an education.

Soon women inspired by Mary's generosity and goodness joined Mary and together as a community, they set about serving children through providing them with an education. From these humble beginnings, the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart (the Josephites) were founded.

The Sisters of St. Joseph have had a particular focus on caring for the poor through education, baby homes, services for unwed mothers, orphanages, aged care and many other ministries of service to those in need.

Over Mary's lifetime and continuing onto now, the spirit of St. Mary MacKillop is alive through the Sisters of St. Joseph and in many schools and services in her name. In short, Mary was a woman of prayer and immense courage, who;

"Never saw a need without doing something about it!"

Pope Benedict XV1 recognised Mary as Australia's first saint, on 17 October 2010. Mary is an inspirational role model for all Australians, as she is our saint, however all persons of the world can look to Mary for inspiration. She was and still is a great woman to many people. Here at St. Mary MacKillop P.S., the spirit of Mary is most certainly active and alive.

Our children know Mary. They know what she stood for and are inspired to be like her.

Lily (3Y) wrote a prayer yesterday. Lily's prayer sums up much about who Mary is to us here at SMMPS.

On Monday, two Sisters of St. Joseph visited our school. They spoke with all the children in our new Multi-Purpose Room (the old library). Sr. Judith spoke about Mary as a women who lived as part of a community and what that means for us. Sr. Jeanne spoke to the children about the work of Joseph's Corner.

Joseph's Corner is a ministry run by the Sisters of St. Joseph in the Western suburbs of Melbourne. Joseph's Corner provides support to families of people who suffer from alcohol and drug addiction. The Sisters recognised services are available for addicts, however they saw a need to care for and support the families of addicts, as there was no service for them.

Joseph's Corner provides counselling, food, basic goods, and gift hampers at Christmas, at the very least. They also assist with paying essential service bills when needed (e.g. electricity etc). This is a tremendous and practical service. The Sisters see a need and are doing something about it!

BUT WHAT CAN WE DO TO SUPPORT JOSEPH'S CORNER and MARY MACKILLOP'S SISTERS OF ST. JOSEPH!

Dona (6Y) came up with a suggestion... and what a wonderful response to a need!

We are holding our Book Fair this week. If every family bought at least one book and donated it to Joseph's Corner, we would be able to provide Joseph's Corner with many books to provide to families in need. As Sr. Jeanne said to me yesterday, many of the children in the families they serve would never have owned a new book. What a wonderful gift we would be providing to these children, through your generosity of buying at least one book.

Cash, Eftpos, Online ordering (credit card) & cheques(made payable to the school) will be available.


Please support our book fair as the school receives a commission from the sales to purchase new books for the library.


