#### SCHOOL CLOSURE

As usual, we need to prepare for and plan for the 2018 School Year. This year we have a 100% retention rate of staff, which is great news. This fact says something very positive about our school and the culture and climate, which exists here.

With all staff remaining, it will be easier to gather to plan for 2018. In the past, we have done so over a number of days, inviting new staff in and replacing existing staff for planning. This is disruptive for children and interrupts programmes. The process has also cost upwards of \$15,000 in costs.

With the approval of Monsignor Portelli, we have been granted a **School Closure on Wednesday 6 December 2017.** On this day, all teaching staff have been timetabled from 8:00am – 5:00pm, to plan with their 2018 teams, with school leaders facilitating this collaboration.

This day will save a great deal of money and will mean no disruption to children or scheduled programmes.

# Computer-proof Kids

We are all citizens in the digital world. This article is about how to protect



you and your children from potential threats in the digital world. This article will teach you how to care for your child's wellbeing and feelings, because the internet can be very dangerous. This will educate you on ways to stop your child from being hurt, and teach you how to prevent these things from happening.

#### What is a digital citizen?

So have you used the internet, posted a comment or picture, looked at something on the internet or logged on to the internet? Well, if you have done any of those things you are a digital citizen. This means that you are part of a community of internet users. But before you make your child one you should get to know the important things about being one. If you posted your new born baby it is a digital citizen, if you post your toddler on the internet they are a digital citizen, if you send a picture of a street drummer they become a digital citizen. Being in the digital community it means that you must choose wisely with what you say and what you do.

#### A digital foot print?

What is a digital foot print? A digital foot print is an invisible trail you leave when you go onto the internet. Websites can track you and



your <u>personal</u> information. But if the wrong information is shared, it might fall in to the wrong hands. Digital foot prints are not bad, in fact they help police find people who are missing or in trouble with the law. Digital foot prints can never be deleted and are important; they are the map to where you and your kids go on the internet. Make sure you set limits and rules on what websites your child is allowed to view.

#### **Privacy**

When talking to kids about computer privacy give an example like "would you tell a random stranger all about you?" they will defiantly say NO. So to make explaining easier here is a list of rules anyone can follow:

- Never meet someone you met online never do this it can put your life at risk this is why it is number one.
- Never share private information this is important as number one it also puts your life at risk, and it means that random people can know everything about you.
- Never tell anyone your address or real name - sharing your real name is the wrong thing to do never share your name or address on games, on the internet or on social media.
- 4. Never tell anyone your password this one is pretty straight forward
- Don't download illegal things never do something illegal because you will be found.
- 6. Have a conversation with your child about what they do online.

Ask your child to follow these simple rules when online. And always remember to monitor what they do, say and think about online.



#### Cyber bullying

Cyber bullying is when someone abuses you on social media or on the internet. The bullying may be done on a phone, tablet or anything that has the internet. Cyber bullying is a type of bullying and should be dealt with quickly.

If your child is being cyber bullied there are some things you and your child must do and know:

- When your child receives the message make sure they don't delete it. This acts as evidence.
- When they get the message make sure they talk to a friend or family member that they trust.
- If they don't want to talk to others around them, they can contact the kids help line.
- They can do something they love, that will cheer them up.






