On Tuesday July 24th, we were very privileged to have had Leigh Hobbs a renowned Australian author and illustrator visit SMMPS and work with all the students from P-6. There was definitely a sense of excitement amongst the children to have finally met the author they have been researching and learning about.


Throughout his interactive workshop Leigh instructed the children on how to illustrate some of the characters from his books, such as, Mr Chicken, Old Tom and Horrible Harriet and also to create their own characters. Leigh inspired all children with his message of individuality and creativity and that everyone is capable of creating characters by starting with a simple scribble and then building on this.

Leigh spoke about the importance of pictures adding meaning to the print and how various types of lines, angles and colour can represent a character's feelings and personality. This is called Visual Literacy. All students will continue to explore and analyse images this term using shortlisted books from the Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA) leading up to Book Week in August.
