Child Safety at

Saint Mary MacKillop Primary School SMMPS Commitment to Child Safety

At **Saint Mary MacKillop Primary School** we hold the care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people as a central and fundamental responsibility of our school. Our commitment is drawn from and inherent in the teaching and mission of Jesus Christ, with love, justice and the sanctity of each human person at the heart of the gospel (<u>CECV Commitment Statement to Child Safety</u>).

The person of each individual human being, in his or her material and spiritual needs, is at the heart of Christ's teaching: that is why the promotion of the human person is the goal of the Catholic school (Congregation for Catholic Education 1997, n. 9).

We have zero tolerance to child abuse, and all allegations and safety concerns will be treated seriously and consistently with our robust policies and procedures.

In the spirit of Saint Mary MacKillop, we want children to feel safe, happy and empowered. We support and respect all children, as well as our staff and volunteers.

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We are committed to the safety, participation and empowerment of all children.

We have legal and moral obligations to contact authorities when we are concerned about a child's safety, which we follow rigorously.

Saint Mary MacKillop Primary School is committed to preventing child abuse and identifying risks early, and removing and reducing these risks.

Saint Mary MacKillop Primary School has robust human resources and recruitment practices for all staff and volunteers.

Saint Mary MacKillop Primary School is committed to regularly training and educating our staff and volunteers on child abuse risks.

We support and respect all children, as well as our staff and volunteers. We are committed to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children, the cultural safety of children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and to providing a safe environment for children with a disability.

We have specific policies, procedures and training in place that support our leadership team, staff and volunteers to achieve these commitments.

Further to our commitment to Child Safety, we prioritise the physical health of our children also....

With an estimated 1 in 20 children suffering from food allergies and **approximately 45 children in our school being diagnosed with being at risk of a potentially life threatening food allergy – anaphylaxis**, it is important that we as a community take the risk of severe allergic reactions seriously. Whilst we can never create a completely 'safe, allergen free' environment for students diagnosed with allergies, we can certainly help reduce the risk if everyone does their bit.

A few small steps can make our school a safer place for all children:

- 1. Talk to your child about the importance of not sharing food at school, and washing their hands after lunch.
- 2. Avoid packing foods with nuts or other allergens if requested by your child's class teacher.
- 3. If you are uncertain about sending an item to school please check with your child's teacher.
- 4. Take 10 minutes with your children to see if they are allergy aware
- 5. Read the school's anaphylaxis policy on our website or follow the link. Anaphylaxis Policy

Are you allergy aware? Take the test and see.

Do you...

- 1. Understand that allergies can be life threatening? Up to 10 Australians die from mostly preventable allergic reactions and thousands more require emergency treatment. Be aware that even very small amounts of food can trigger life threatening allergic reactions.
- 2. Know about your child's school/preschool/day care allergy policies/guidelines? Your school can inform you on what safety strategies they need you to help them with. Always stick to the safety strategies that have been implemented yes, they do make a difference! Remember, no one chooses to have food allergies.

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- 3. Know someone with a food allergy? If you do, talk with them or their parents about the triggers, symptoms, first aid procedures and ask them for hands-on training in the use of the EpiPen an auto-injector containing adrenaline which reverses the symptoms of severe allergic reactions.
- 4. Talk with your children about food allergy? If not, then take some time to do so -chances are they have someone in their school class, soccer team or ballet lesson with the condition.

PARENT FACILITIES

If parents/carers or toddlers supervised by their parent or carers or need to use a WC, we request that you do not use the children's' toilets. We have installed a new WC in the hallway next to the sickbay. This WC is for the use of parents/carers or toddlers supervised by their parent or carers.

We have made this request as this action also supports our child safety initiatives. In short, if a staff member sees an adult in the children's WC, they know to inquire and direct the adult to the correct facility.

Quite simply, it is all about keeping your kids safe.

CAR PARK and drop off and pick up

I ask you to remain ever vigilant in using the school grounds for dropping off, picking up and parking. Do not double park or speed. Move very slowly as little children are running everywhere and as we know are most unpredictable.

IT IS TO YOU AS DRIVERS PARKING OR WAITING FOR YOUR CHILDREN AND YOU AS PARENTS OF CARERS WALKING YOUR CHILDREN THROUGH THE CAR PARK TO KEEP YOUR CHILDREN SAFE.

As a courtesy, our staff are circulating, but it not their responsibility to remind you of basic manners on the road or in the car park.

If everyone cooperates we will continue to have a safe school. THANK-YOU

Just some reminders:

-the rear carpark needs to be cleared by 9:10am as Phys.Ed. and Sport Lessons begin at this time.

-the back car park gate is locked at 9:15 am and re-opened at around 2.30pm to 2.45 pm.

The 1st issue will be sent home this week and all orders must be <u>in no later than 2pm Friday</u> <u>15th February.</u>




