


Students will contribute to and participate in classroom and school prayer opportunities, including attending Mass.

Number and Algebra

Students will read, write, order and make numbers to tens of thousands. They will partition, rearrange and regroup numbers to assist with calculations involving addition and subtraction.

Inquiry

Rich Question: Why do natural disasters occur?

Students will explore different natural disasters and how/why they occur. They will investigate the impact of natural disasters on both people and the environment, and will explore how scientific knowledge contributes to how we respond when disaster strikes.



Passion Projects

Students will foster their curiosity of the world through Passion Projects. They will generate questions that will guide their research of their selected topic. The students will identify dispositions that can assist them with challenging situations. Students may create a final product with the aim of sharing this with an audience.

Students will be involved in establishing class routines and will practice these to prepare for learning. They will identify personal, academic, social and emotional strengths and work towards setting personal goals.



Social awareness and management

Students will identify the roles and responsibilities of themselves, their peers and their teacher. They will examine the idea that fair does not always mean equal in academic and social contexts.

Physical Education

Students will focus on their throwing and catching at the start of the term in preparation for their Cricket unit. They will focus on throwing and catching in various games to develop their fielding skills.

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Students will interpret ideas and information, record key facts, from viewed/spoken texts.
