

Dear Community,

We have well and truly moved into the school year. I am proud to report that, in the main, the children appear to have settled well. I appreciate there is always a period of adjustment as children settle into new class cohorts navigating their way around new relationships with peers and teachers. Even the most confident of children may be finding it all a bit hard. However, I am confident with the emphasis placed on relationships at our school and the absolutely quality of our teachers, all will be well.

Patience is a virtue.

As a young woman, Mary MacKillop wrote to her Sisters:

Have patience with yourselves when you see that you have failed and patience with others when they seem to have done so ... Mary MacKillop – February 16, 1874

Pope Francis has said to the world:

' ... Have you thought about God's patience, the patience God has with each one of us?
That is God's mercy. God always has patience, patience with us.
God understands us, and waits for us ...'

The children will notice difference. Last year's class is different from this year's class. Last year's learning may have been less challenging than this year's learning. Last year's teacher is different from this year's teacher.



Your children will come home with stories from their day. Some will be happy and other stories will tell of the child's anxieties and struggles. We **must** listen to them and respect their story.

However, **in the spirit of St Francis of Assisi, we must, "seek first to understand."** Talk to your child calmly and without overdramatising their story. Listen and then if necessary seek further information from your child's teacher or relevant party that can offer a non-biased opinion.

Remember our concern is for your child's wellbeing and education. We want all children to feel valued and listened to. We want all children to feel safe and we want all children to develop patience. We as the adults, model the way. We need to *walk the talk*. We need to teach our children skills that they might learn how to be in this world.

I offer these few reflections as a principal, parent and grandparent. I listen to the many children over whom I have influence, both here at school and at home. I am always respectful and strive to understand. I also appreciate there are always two sides to a story, so it is critical to seek the truth. In this way all children can feel safe.

Of course, **Child Safety** is a priority within our school. Our school Vision Statement clearly states, '*In* and through positive relationships, we aspire to protect all children under our care, prioritising their safety and wellbeing.' Our **practice** of listening and striving to seek truth contributes to each child's safety and wellbeing.

This is something of which I am personally proud.

Another issue which we face is our child's online practices. I came across this snippet and thought you may be interested...

How to keep your child safe online:

- Your child should not use their full name online; they should use a nickname or their first name only.
- They should not disclose their address or phone number online.
- They should not post or share photos of themselves that show their identity or location (such as a school logo).
- Manage your child's security settings on online networking sites to protect their privacy and review them regularly.
- Consider whether the 'chat' function enabled on apps and games is necessary.
- If you are concerned a child is at risk of online (sexual) exploitation, report it to police or visit <u>thinkuknow.org.au/report</u>.



Please talk to James Quinn, our ICT leader at the school, if you need further advice or support regarding online safety. I appreciate it's a minefield, however we might be able to offer some support or direct you to a resource for support.



You can place your child's order at scholastic.com.au/loop or by using the LOOP app, which can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play. **No cash payments to the office will be accepted.**

Owning your own books is something special! I hope that you will encourage your child to order books this year. Each order helps earn free books and teaching resources for the school, however there is never any obligation to order. I know of no better way to encourage reading than to allow children to choose the books they want to read.

Thank you to the families who ordered from Issue 1, over \$1,500 worth of books were bought, earning the school over \$300 in rewards points. The catalogue for Issue 2 will be available very soon.

I authorise the Department of Education and Training (DET) to use Centrelink Confirmation eServices to perform an enquiry of my Centrelink customer details and concession card status in order to enable the business to determine if I qualify for a concession, rebate or service. I also authorise the Australian Government Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide the results of that enquiry to DET.

I understand that:

- DHS will use information I have provided to DET to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DET personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- this consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DHS and provide it to DET so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
- if I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DET.
- information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

You are able to request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or nongovernment Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two.
- Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see:

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (28 January 2020) or term two (14 April 2020).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2020 closes on 26 June, 2020.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years. Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.
