- What are we sensing about what is now different in the ways we might be willing to work together?
- What question are we now willing to ask that we weren't before? What is really clear now that wasn't before?
- What have we discovered to be essential?
- What things that we lived without, can we avoid letting back in?
- What have we deeply missed?
- What things should we bring back in?

In essence I am asking ...

What do you want to retain?

What new ways of working do we want to keep and deepen?

What do you want to 'chuck' out?

The results thus far are interesting.
