Student Initiated Inquiry at SMMPS

At SMMPS we value and emphasis *Student Initiated Inquiry (SII)* from P-6. Student initiated inquiries are powerful learning opportunities for students to develop learner capabilities, ignite curiosity and creativity and deepen student thinking. Students are provided with the time to pursue their own interests and passions that are strongly connected to the Victorian Curriculum.

So what does SII look like at SMMPS?

In **P-2 Discovery Based Inquiry** values the interests and experiences young learners bring to school, as well as, build new experiences to extend and build upon curiosities and wonderings. It is an opportunity for students to learn more about themselves, others and the world they live in. During Discovery students make choices about the learning they want to engage in, who they do this with and where. Teachers design the learning environment by providing materials and provocations that support student learning in addition to stimulating different types of thinking.



In **Years 3 - 4 SII is known as Passion Projects**. Passion Projects are an opportunity for students to follow their passions or interests and develop their ability to manage their learning more independently. When students are given the opportunity to learn something that has real meaning for them, they become more engaged and motivated to learn.





In Years 5-6 SII is known as 80/20 time. Quite simply, the name 80/20 was derived from Google's philosophy of 80% of the time employees would engage in their normal work duties and 20% of the time they were able to work on ideas and projects that interested them. As a result of this '20% free time', Gmail originated in 2009. At SMMPS students spend 80% of their time engaging in teacher directed learning and 20% of their time exploring and engaging in self directed learning. In 80/20 students plan and manage a multi-step project that will stretch their thinking and develop dispositions, which will enable them to become independent and reflective learners.
