

Dear Community,



This seasonal shift also brings to mind the life and legacy of St. Mary MacKillop, whose unwavering faith and dedication serve as a guiding light through times of change. St. Mary MacKillop exemplifies how to navigate the seasons of life with grace and resilience. Her life was marked by significant challenges and profound acts of faith, much like the transitions from autumn to winter.

This week our Year 3 student's along with their parent's and teachers reflected on the importance and significance of receiving the Sacrament of Communion at our Sacramental Family Faith Evening held in the MPR. Sister Rita, a Josephite nun led us in exploring the importance of the sacrament and reflected on the fact that First Communion is a profound event that encompasses spiritual, religious, communal, educational, cultural, and personal dimensions. It is a key moment in a Catholic person's faith journey, enhancing their relationship with God and their community.

At this week's assembly the Year 5 students lead us in prayer. They spoke about the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity and about the Three Persons of God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. We understand that God is all of these people in one. They reminded us that Jesus was sent to teach us what it means to love one another and to show us what kindness, compassion and love for others looks like.

As we move from autumn to winter take this opportunity to pray and reflect as a family with this prayer inspired by St Mary MacKillop:

'Heavenly Father, as we transition from the warmth of autumn to the chill of winter, we thank You for the beauty and lessons of each season. Inspired by St. Mary MacKillop, may we embrace change with faith, prepare our hearts with patience, and hold onto hope for renewal. Help us to see Your presence in every season of our lives and to act with kindness and compassion towards others. Amen.'

St. Mary MacKillop Primary School is committed to child safety. We believe all students deserve, as a fundamental right, safety and protection from all forms of abuse and neglect.

#### **REMINDERS**

- The School opens at 8.30am and children can enter the classroom at 8.50am. Please do not drop children off prior to 8.30am. If you need to bring your child to school before 8.30am please book them into the before school hours program.
- St Mary MacKillop is a 'Smoke Free Zone' and smoking on the school grounds in not permitted. According to the law, 'The Tobacco Act 1987 bans smoking or vaping on school premises or within 4 metres of any pedestrian access point to school premises.'
   Please do not smoke on the school grounds.
- If your child needs to bring a mobile phone to school it **must be handed** into the teacher in the morning where it will be stored in a secured location and returned to them in the afternoon. Please refer to the Mobile phone policy on the following pages.
- The basketball court is used as a carpark in the morning and afternoon. The safety of our children is of utmost importance and therefore I ask that you take extra care when driving in the carpark areas, The speed limit is **5km per hour** and there is to be no double parking at all.

Thank you for taking the safety of our children seriously.



#### CHANGES TO NOTE

- As there is no supervision on the playground area in the morning, the playground is out of bounds and children are not to play on the playground before school.
- The front drive through area between the Church and the School operates as a drive through zone only before school.
- Due to a few near misses, those who wish to park and bring their child into class must use the back car park area. There is now no parental parking in bays outside the front of the Church.

#### **School Attendance**

I would like to reinforce the importance of students attending school and being present and ready to learn by 9.00am every day. Classes begin at 9.00am so we can maximise the learning time the students have at school.

When students arrive late, they miss the important whole class instruction period and are therefore missing key concepts, modelling and information that is vital to their learning.

Please note that if your child/ren are late (after 9.10am), they **must** come to the office to be signed in late. **Parents are not to accompany them straight to their classroom.** 

I also understand that there are times when early departures cannot be avoided. In these cases, I would appreciate if you could pick your child/ren up at either 11.00am-start of lunch break, 11.45am-end of lunch break, 1.40pm-start of second break or 2.20pm-end of second break as picking up during class times disrupts the lesson and the other children in the class.

Due to the busy nature of the office and classroom in the afternoon, we cannot call children out of class between 3pm – 3.15pm (unless it is an emergency). Please try and collect your children in the hours listed above if they must leave early.


