ASH WEDNESDAY and LENT

The forty days of Lent, the days before Holy Week and Easter commenced on Ash Wednesday. The children in Years 3-6 celebrated Mass in our church and received the Ashes, whilst many children in Years 4, 5 and 6 also received the Eucharist. The children in Years 1 and 2 received the Ashes in a simple prayer service later in the day. The sign of the cross on the forehead, marked with ashes, reminds us of our need to change.

We asked children to wear purple on the day, to assist them in recognising the significance of Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season to come.

Lent asks us to focus less on ourselves and more on others. It is a time to think of how we might make better choices and in doing so, make changes for the better. Taking time to reflect, as Jesus did when he spent 40 days in the desert, can help us to be better people.

For children; it might be as simple as cleaning up their room, obeying their parents or not fighting with siblings or school mates.

For us, as adults; it might mean being more patient with our kids and even our partner. It may even include, simply being more attentive to our partner. There are many simple ways we can make changes for the better.

In our school, we collect money for **Project Compassion** during Lent. For almost 60 years, Lent has been a time where many Catholic communities, throughout Australia give to those less fortunate. Project Compassion is a creative campaign organised by Caritas Australia, an arm of the Australian Catholic Church that provides works to eradicate poverty and injustice.

SMMPS has received our ranking for NAPLAN 2022. Out of 2,277 Registered Public, Private and Catholic Schools in Victoria, we ranked 419, placing SMMPS in the top 20%.

We ranked, in most cases, significantly higher than other Catholic and Public schools in the neighbouring area and suburbs. We are very proud. However, we will not rest on our laurels. We will always aim to do better.

SMMPS continues to maintain enrolments. We are very proud of this fact, as many schools are experiencing declining enrolments. In fact, our enrolments could be higher, but I have made a commitment to prioritising enrolling Catholic families. I intend to keep the school at 3 streams, i.e. 3 classes per level, as opposed to 4 classes per level.

We are a strong Catholic school and I am very proud and grateful to all families for your continued support.
