Our aim is to reconnect our school and parent community in a COVID and hopefully soon, a post-COVID world!


We have all missed out on that sense of being together.

Learning Conversations Term 3

This term we will have another opportunity to discuss the progress of your child through a formal Learning Conversation led by the student. We tried this process previously and we have received positive feedback as the students take on a lead role to share and take ownership of their learning.

In the learning conversations your child will share work they are proud of and discuss their progress (supported by their classroom teacher, if needed). It is a great opportunity for your child to reflect on their own learning whilst increasing pride in their achievements.

The dates and times for these conversations are:

Tuesday 10th August 1pm-6:45pm Wednesday 11th August 3:45pm-6:45pm

In a nutshell:

Role of the student - to share a work sample that they are proud of and highlight their strengths or areas of improvement.

Role of the parent - to listen, provide encouragement and praise, and ask qualifying questions

Role of the teacher - to facilitate the conversation and contribute any comments or questions.

In an effort to make these Learning Conversations beneficial below is a list of prompts you may like to use:

- I am pleased to see your effort in
- I am proud of your improvement in
- What makes this your best work in
- How did you go about doing it?
- Did you encounter any problems?

The student led conversations will run for 15 minutes.

If you would like to discuss something of a private nature with the classroom teacher ONLY, please inform your child's teacher at the beginning of the discussion so that time can be allowed.
