

2022 Term One Overview - Year Three

Religious Education Forgiveness

Students will explore the importance of Forgiveness in their lives. They will interpret Scripture to investigate ways in which they can live in "right relationship" with God, others and the whole of creation. This investigation will support their preparation for the Sacrament of Penance (First Reconciliation). Students will receive the Sacrament of Penance.



Students will explore the meaning of Lent and use this time to reflect on the choices that they make and the impact they have on other people and the world. Students will participate in classroom and school prayer opportunities and attend mass in their class groups.

English Reading

Students will select appropriate texts to read. They will be introduced to a range of strategies to extend their comprehension and vocabulary. Students will be scaffolded through the research process and will learn how to ask good questions and locate and record information to answer their wonderings.




Writing Students will use the

Writing Process to compose writing pieces that entertain and inform. They will have opportunities to develop the craft of writing, as well as, build on organisational structures, such as paragraphs and the correct use of punctuation. Students will continue to be exposed to various spelling strategies

Mathematics

Number and Algebra

Students will develop their understanding of place value with numbers up to four digits. They will skip count by 2, 3, 5, and 10 from various starting points. Students will investigate strategies that can be applied when adding and subtracting numbers up to 1000.



Measurement and Geometry

Students will measure the length and height of objects using the formal units of centimetres and metres.

Chance and Data

Students will plan questions and collect data from their peers. This data will be presented in a graph

Inquiry Animals in Our World

Students will further develop their research skills in an exploration of animals. They will have the opportunity to ask questions, locate and record information about a chosen animal, using a variety of online and print resources. Students will share their findings electronically.

Extended Discovery

In preparation for Passion Projects in Term 2, Students will engage in a range of discovery stations and will be scaffolded to undertake simple projects of their own.

Students will reflect on their learning journey and make connections to the following learning dispositions: reflective, collaborative, curious, creative, flexible, self-motivated and persistent.
