SCHOOL REVIEW

Every four years Catholic Education Melbourne, now Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) commissions an independent review of each Catholic school in the diocese. It is five years since our last review, due to COVID.

We are well into the process.

We have completed over 350 pages of compliance documents that are required by the Victorian Regulation and Qualifications Authority (VRQA). This is basically the legal requirements that are necessary for the school to operate. We successfully completed this aspect.

As you may recall, we had two school closures last term, where the staff placed the school on the School Improvement Framework Rubric, based on evidence that we were able to collect.

The Rubric examines the Five Spheres of Catholic Schooling:

- Religious Dimension
- Learning and Teaching
- Leadership and Management
- Student Wellbeing
- School Community.

We have provided this Rubric and a great deal of evidence to Dr. Mary Lovelock, the independent school reviewer.

Dr. Lovelock has toured the school. She will be attending the school on Wednesday 13 July, meeting with focus groups of leaders, teachers, parents and students.

Dr. Lovelock will then return to our school on Friday 15 July to visit classrooms and chat with students and teachers.

We expect to meet with Dr. Lovelock and receive a report in the next weeks, which will suggest recommendations, which will become opportunities for school improvement.

We will use this report to construct our next four-year School Improvement Plan (SIP). We will construct this SIP with support from MACS staff and present it our School Advisory Council.

I am grateful for the support being offered by many members of our community as we engage in this extremely valuable process.



SCHOOL BASED PROGRAMS


