It surprised many that they usually don't have to resort to handling weapons and usually try to talk to people in the situation and the witnesses. Talking is their best tool. Everyone enjoyed asking questions and finding out more about what it was like to be a Police Officer.

Two lucky students got to try on the vests which Police wear out and about. They also got to tune into the radio just to find out that there was a situation occurring near us and the Police had clear procedures on how to control this situation. Thank you for your care and helping us to be safe.

It was a really great experience as the Year 6 students learned so much. Now many of us want to be Police Officers!
