I write in a spirit of gratitude as we have much to celebrate as we move further into our term.

Last night (Wednesday 2 August) ... a number of our children in Years 5 and 6 performed in Wakakirri; a Performing Arts Showcase for primary aged students. This performance was held at The Clocktower in Moonee Ponds.

This year we reintroduced Performing Arts at SMMPS with the endorsement of our School Advisory Council. **Mrs. Laura Kandzidis**, our Performing Arts teacher is doing a marvellous job in developing the children's confidence and promoting their engagement as they learn to take on a character and act the character out in front of their peers and now in a national showcase.

Last evening, we witnessed the spirit of our school, alive and pumping. It's times like this that make all our work and efforts worthwhile.

Wakakirri was a huge success. Congratulations to all the boys and girls from Years 5 and 6 who performed so successfully. We were proud to be recognised with a number of awards.

Thank you to the many staff who came along to support the children last evening. Thank you to the performer's parents who allowed their children to participate, supported them on their journey and were present last evening.

Mrs. Sarina Commisso, our Italian teacher, supported Laura and the children. As the performance told an Italian story and much of the performance was in Italian, Sarina's input, advice and support was much appreciated. (I am also delighted to see the children's study of Italian, over their time at primary school, as their Language other than English, being made relevant and put to good practice.) **Thank you, Sarina!**

Every time our school was mentioned, the screams and shouts from the auditorium, certainly out did all the other schools! I was told our kids were in tears of pride and joy out back when they could hear us roar! That's team spirit. This is our school! I am very proud of everyone involved and privileged to be the Principal leader of our school.

I am committed to our Performing Arts program. Not all children are academic. Not all children can kick or throw a ball. Whilst these are important skills and we strive to teach them to the children; what we are offering through Performing Arts is another opportunity for children to shine and show their talents.

I hope to publish a YouTube link of the performance in the coming week or so, when it is made available. Watch this space. It will also be on our website.

The **Prep/One Backyard** the space behind the wall on Sunshine Avenue, is finally, all but complete. (We are finalising a number of smaller tidy ups and have ordered rubber strips to install, to ensure the edging is safe.) However, the children are now using this space. It's a great space for the children to play, learn and socialise. I note they are having great fun playing in the two 'forts' constructed on this space and also, some children are enjoying rolling down the hill! In the future, I hope to place some small pieces of play equipment on the hill. We are investigating options at the moment.

All and all it is about creating the best and safest places for the children of SMMPS.

Tension Woods, our new **Library**, **Digital Technologies Studio and Visual Arts Studio is** near complete. Landscaping should be completed today and there are just a few minor 'defects' that need to be addressed. We would expect the key, as soon as the Occupancy permit is granted. Of course, we also need to wait for the site sheds to be removed and the area around them cleaned up.

Shade Sail. During COVID, the State Government granted many schools \$25,000 to construct shade sails in their school yards under the **Victorian Government School Shade Sail Fund.** You can imagine demand and supply become an issue. However, more than twelve months later, our turn has come, and our shade sail is finally being installed. You will notice it being erected between John Paul 11 and Penola, giving the children in Years 5 and 6, an excellent outdoor learning space and also providing additional shade space during recesses. We are grateful to the Victorian State Government for this grant.

We do have much to celebrate!

My concern is to ensure ongoing school improvement.

I firmly believe, backed by research; if you provide an attractive learning environment, children will be proud of their school and more engaged, which ultimately will lead to higher student outcomes. And that is what we are here for; to ensure the children succeed and believe in themselves as learners.

On a personal note; I am very excited to welcome my fourth grandchild, Henry Mac Nave, who was born to my daughter Sarah and her partner Chris, on 17 July 2023. I take great pride in watching my family grow and I am grateful to God for his blessings.

EXPLORING THE NGV

We launched our learning by considering our own view and image of God and then went on to explore how God, religious beliefs, symbols and tradition have been depicted in artwork through the ages, at the National Gallery of Victoria. We took along our notebooks and pencils and made notes and sketches to collect our ideas.



IN OUR CLASSROOMS

This term, the Year 5 students are using their Religious Education lessons to explore the question: How can I know God? We are going to be focusing on how the Sacred Scriptures teach us about how the people of the Old and New Testaments and the people of the Church today know God through imagery.



WHAT DID WE FIND?

We discovered so many things! Here are some of the ideas we took away about how artists express their faith:

- tell stories of their understanding of scripture
- transport stories into their own time
- use colour as symbols, especially red, blue and gold
- the number 3 is important (trinity)
- stained glass was believed to let the light from the heavens illuminate the images
- Halos and crowns tell us who is part of the holy family or a saint
- angels
- doves, rays of light and fire symbolise God
- Mother Mary is often depicted with flowers
- IHS and YHS are the Greek letter for Jesus' name

The idea behind Readorama is to build Book Love and our reading stamina.

Reading for 20 minutes outside of school time, results in better learning outcomes across the entire curriculum, according to research. Students need to be able to read to access all subject areas. This experience and confidence sets them up for success.

We have seen a significant increase in the amount of reading done by students compared to last year, which is wonderful.
