Greetings Everyone,

What a great assortment of activities we have enjoyed so far this term. I have been delighted to witness the engagement of the children in their everyday lessons and have been excited to see a number of special events.

We welcomed the Grandparents of our Prep children on Grandparent's Day, which is now an annual event for our Prep children. We look forward to welcoming the Grandparents of our Year 6 class, on Monday 4 December, as these young people say farewell to our school. We hope to make this an annual event also.

We celebrated the Month of Mary, the mother of Jesus. We reflected the Catholic identity of our school when the children from Years 3-6 gathered to pray the Rosary in our Church. We had planned a procession of the statue of Our Lady, which is very much within our Catholic tradition, however rain put a stop to the procession.

The children in Year 5 visited the Mary MacKillop Heritage Centre in East Melbourne. This visit is scheduled for Year 5 children each year, to give them the opportunity to grow in their understanding of Mary MacKillop, the person and saint of the Church.

I think this visit is particularly pertinent, as it gives the children the opportunity to place Mary MacKillop, as a daughter of Melbourne; born in Fitzroy. Mary was an ordinary woman from a somewhat dysfunctional family, struggling to make their way in poverty, yet Mary did extraordinary things. She knew 'brokenness' and was able to empathise with the 'broken'. As a result, she saw needs and did something about it.

This annual visit to Mary MacKillop Heritage Centre is followed up the next year, when the children in Year 6 visit Sydney and spend time at Mary MacKillop Place, where Mary lived the last years of her life, died and was buried. Her tomb is a sacred place for the children to visit and to grow in love and appreciation of this marvellous woman and Saint.

Last week our Year 6 cohort of children visited Sydney for three days. We have been making this trip for a number of years. In fact, Year 6 have been travelling interstate with the school for the past 16 years.

I need to acknowledge our wonderful children. The behaviour and engagement of each and every child on our trip to Sydney was outstanding. They were nothing short of an absolute delight to be around and made the trip to Sydney very enjoyable.

The kids remained patient, despite flight delays and managed their way through airport security well. Staff did a great job too, supporting 72 kids through security!

All of the experiences were very successful. The children engaged, listened, contributed and were most respectful.

I must sincerely thank the teachers who planned, organised, booked the many happenings and then attended the Year 6 Sydney trip. Thank you to Anthony D'Amico, Bree Artuso, Heath Thomas, Jennifer Brittain, Kellie Doherty, Kirsten Mifsud, Natalie Mulford, Ross Botoulas, and Stephanie Adam most sincerely for their time, generosity, effort, attentiveness and care given.

Our kids are blessed to have such teachers that give so much to them and to each other.

Their level of concern for the children's care and wellbeing and management skills kept the kids safe at all times.







St. Mary MacKillop Primary School is committed to child safety. We believe all students deserve, as a fundamental right, safety and protection from all forms of abuse and neglect.







