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


Staying Connected No. 15, 2023

FEES & LEVIES 2024

School Fees

Family Fee: \$2,600

The Family Fee largely supports business administration costs, building and grounds maintenance, power and services costs and additional staffing costs.

Other School Charges

Curriculum Levy per child:

\$675

The Curriculum Levy provides for all:

Student books, stationery, classroom supplies, library books and specialist supplies (e.g. Phys.Ed equipment), IT hardware, software, and licences, Excursions including transport (buses) and entrance costs,

Building Levy per family:

\$250 per year.

This levy supports capital loan repayments which provide for the continual upgrade of buildings and facilities.

Year 5 and 6-Social Justice Actions at SMMPS

The children and families of the Year 5 and 6 children worked on their own social justice campaign, "Offerings of Hope." In response to a call out from the local organisation, Launch Housing, who work with women and children in need of support, the senior students and their families filled shoe boxes with essential personal items and small "pops of joy" for a more hopeful and joyful Christmas.

The spirit of God this Advent season, and living in action to bring hope, peace, joy and love to others has been truly alive at St Mary MacKillop School this term. SEASON OF HOPE

ADVENT SOCIAL JUSTICE ACTIONS

This term, our school community has been very busy in bringing the spirit of Advent and hope to others, through a number of social justice actions.

The children and families in **Prep to Year 3** collected donations of food, toys and books for our Keilor Downs community's St Vincent de Paul organisation. More than 15 huge baskets of goodies were donated to go towards children and families in our own community who will especially appreciate them on Christmas Day.

In Year 4, the children used their Inquiry learning to drive their social action: designing, producing and selling Christmas ornaments and goodies at their market stall. An enormous amount of effort over a number of weeks went into this project and their very generous families and our teaching staff had the opportunity to visit their market stalls and purchase their creations. All of their hard work amounted to more than \$2000 in profit. The Year 4s are using this money to purchase toys for children of all ages, to be donated to the K Mart Wishing Tree Foundation. Another fantastic, hope-giving action!







Literacy News

Students have done some amazing learning this year in reading, writing, speaking and listening. This was exemplified today when the year 6 students presented their buddies with a picture storybook they created in their writing time this term.

The process involved surveying their prep buddies to find out what kinds of stories they enjoyed reading. Then they drafted their stories using all of the skills they have built as writers. They chose their characters, the setting, and planned the narrative plot. They experimented with vocabulary and attention grabbing beginnings. Overseen by teachers, the year 6 students took responsibility for the revising and editing of their writing, which showed their knowledge of spelling, grammar and punctuation. In order to publish their books they worked on layout and illustration techniques.

Carnevale Day 2023 STUDENTS GET A TASTE OF ITALY






GRADE 6 GAMES DAY




