#### **Writing**

Students will be given opportunities to write texts based on a variety of topics.

They will be given regular opportunities to take their writing through the steps in the writing process: organising their ideas in a cohesive manner, exploring word choice, constructing simple and compound sentences: revising for meaning and editing spelling and grammar.

Students will continue to build on their knowledge of spelling using familiar sound patterns when spelling new words. They continue to build their knowledge of high frequency words. They build connections between known words to work out the spelling of new words.

### Discovery Learning

Students will engage in areas of interest to explore and investigate concepts through play.

They will choose from a range of experiences to create, imagine, construct, discover or invent.

Students will reflect on their learning and make connections to the following learning dispositions: reflective, collaborative, curious, creative, flexible, selfmotivated and persistent.



Students will continue to establish routines within the classroom by identifying how they can be responsible, respectful, resourceful and safe learners.

#### Italian (2B & 2Y)

The students will continue to revise numbers 1-20 in Italian. They will explore the Italian vocabulary based on the big book "Mangia, Mangia" (Eat! Eat!)mangia la frutta e verdura. (Eat fruit and vegetables). The students will be encouraged to express their likes and dislikes. The focus will be on sentence structures and the correct use of gender in the Italian language.
