Performing Arts

In Performing Arts this term students will investigate some dramatic elements and explore how and why these are important when making drama. They will support this understanding by watching various performances and analysing the ways they are successful at telling a story and creating mood. Students will explore duologues and the ways they can bring a character to life. They will be exposed to various scripts and have the opportunity to choose a duologue to perform.

Italian (5Y & 5R)

Students will explore Italian vocabulary based on the concept L'ORTO ITALIANO -Italian garden students will be exposed to the cultural importance of having a L'orto (garden) to Italian migrants' habits and rituals here in Australia . Students will use key grammatical structures to form simple sentences to describe a food item from the food groups in Italian. The main focus is the use of prepositions, definite articles, gender and singular/plural forms. Students are encouraged to predict from word cues in order to
