





Ash Wednesday Mass

A small number of students from our parish were selected to go on a trip to learn about Caritas Australia with Mrs Taylor. 10 students from our school came and 5 from Saint Paul's. When we arrived we had a look at how beautiful the Academy of Mary Immaculate was. We found out the organisation (Caritas) was having its 60th anniversary and that its mission was to end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity with a passion for action.

As we already know, every year for 6 weeks Caritas raises funds for those in need in this time of Lent. They also said that Almsgiving is justice and that during Lent we should give something up that could be simple or challenging.

A group of religious musicians that have performed in front of the Pope sang a song called "All are welcome." Afterwards, the Archbishop of Melbourne, Peter Andrew Comensoli, told the story of Jesus washing his disciples' feet. Then the choir of The Academy of Mary Immaculate sang absolutely beautifully.

Ambassadors were called up to hold a candle. Matteo was our ambassador. Afterwards, we said a nice prayer and sang a song called "Send us out."

Caritas' theme for this year is "For all future generations".

We also heard the story of Exodus (3:15) and stories about women from across the world. The story that we heard most about was a story of a girl from Malawi named Memory who undertook a 3 year carpentry course and she became the first woman who worked as a carpenter in her village. This year Caritas are aiming to raise more than 10 million dollars, so we spoke about how we could contribute to this in our own schools.

In conclusion, we had a great day learning about a very special charity and we were very privileged to attend such an exceptional event.




