It certainly has been a big couple of weeks in the life of Catholic education.

Last week the Archdiocese of Melbourne celebrated **Catholic Education Week**, where we acknowledged everything good and unique about our schools.

A recent survey has highlighted the enduring benefits associated with Catholic schools in Australia.

Lifelong Advantages of Catholic Education

A study conducted by the Centre for International Research on Education Systems (CIRES) at Victoria University, utilizing data from the Household, Income and Labour Dynamics in Australia (HILDA) Survey, revealed significant lifelong benefits for individuals who attended Catholic schools. Key findings include:

- Higher Employment Rates and Wages: Catholic school graduates are more likely to be employed and tend to earn higher wages compared to those who attended government schools, with wage differences ranging from 4% to 11%.
- Enhanced Life Satisfaction and Health: Attendees of Catholic schools generally report higher levels of life satisfaction and better personal health outcomes.

• **Community Contribution:** Graduates are more inclined to work in industries that contribute positively to the public good and are more likely to donate to charitable causes.

We would hope in some small way, St. Mary MacKillop Primary School play our part in working towards achieving these great results. I stand as a very proud Principal of our school. We have great teachers, wonderful children and supportive families. I am confident that our teachers provide engaging learning opportunities for our children and I trust that they support the children as they navigate the complexities of life's journey. They are children, between the ages of 5-12 years, but as young as they are, they are trying to navigate their way. It is not easy, but I am proud of the fact that they are able to do so, in a safe and caring environment.


Nass of St. Patrick for Schoo

Cathedral in his hands.


Our school Jubilee Ambassadors, Mrs Aprille and Sierra Borg were also commissioned for the year of Jubilee, with a special blessing.

REMINDERS

• The basketball court is used as a carpark in the morning and afternoon. The safety of our children is of utmost importance and therefore I ask that you take extra care when driving in the carpark areas. The speed limit is **5km per hour** and there is to be no double parking at all.

Please only park in the designated parking spots and do not park on the **artificial turf or in pedestrian walk ways.** Thank you for taking the safety of our children seriously.



- From time to time our children forget to bring their lunch to school or a lunch order is ordered for the wrong day and we ask parents to bring in the missing lunch. In order to continue with our healthy eating expectations we ask that parents <u>do not bring in take away food</u> such as McDonalds, KFC etc. If you do need to purchase lunch for your child we ask that you purchase things such as sushi, sandwiches or wraps.
- The School opens at 8.30am and children can enter the classroom at 8.50am. <u>Please do not drop children off prior to 8.30am</u>. If you need to bring your child to school before 8.30am please book them into the before school hours program.
- St Mary MacKillop is a 'Smoke Free Zone' and smoking on the school grounds in not permitted. According to the law, 'The Tobacco Act 1987 bans smoking or vaping on school premises or within 4 metres of any pedestrian access point to school premises.' Please do not smoke or vape on the school grounds.

St. Mary MacKillop Primary School is committed to child safety. We believe all students deserve, as a fundamental right, safety and protection from all forms of abuse and neglet.

- If your child needs to bring a mobile phone to school it must be handed into the teacher in the morning where it will be stored in a secured location and returned to them in the afternoon. Please refer to the Mobile phone policy on the school website.
- As there is no supervision on the playground area and the oval are in the morning, these areas are out of bounds and children are not to play on the playground or the oval before school.
- The front drive through area between the Church and the School operates as a drive through zone only before school.
- Due to a few near misses, those who wish to park and bring their child into class must <u>use the back car park area.</u> There is now no parental parking in bays outside the front of the Church.



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

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one; or
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder; or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (<u>CSEF</u>): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF); Policy | education.vic.gov.au</u>).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, <u>Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
- Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
- If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years. Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.
